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## Appendix A Training Guidelines

### Introduction:

The COVID-19 pandemic is an unprecedented and difficult time. Golf Newfoundland Labrador (Golf NL), and its member courses fully support the recommendations and guidelines of Health Canada, the World Health Organization and our provincial public health experts to stop the community spread of the virus.

Our priority above all else is the health and safety of our people and our communities. Following the Public Health Guidelines developed by the Department of Health and Community Services and the Chief Medical Officer of Health, Golf NL will be implementing the following additional guidelines for a safe return to training.

Participants must read, understand and sign the Compliance Form, Waiver & Release Form and these guidelines.

### GUIDELINES

- Participants should know of the common symptoms of COVID-19 and stay away if displaying any symptoms. Refer to Activity Checklist:
- If you have any symptoms we suggest you complete the self-assessment tool at the URL listed below. Note: Do not attend training session if you are experiencing any symptoms.

- Participants must stay home if they have been in contact with a known case in the previous 14 days.
- Participants, staff and volunteers must wear a non-medical mask with at an indoor training facility.
- Participants should arrive to the indoor training facility no earlier than the designated time to begin the session.
- Parents/Guardians should be outside the facility to pick-up participant immediately after the completion of session.
- Only players will be permitted in the indoor training facility with instructors and staff.
- Avoiding direct person-to-person contact and maintain physical distance (6+ feet) as much as possible.



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- Wash and sanitize hands before and after each session.
- Sanitize equipment before and after each session
- Do not touch other participants clubs, the person or their equipment.
- Use available alcohol based sanitizing wipes at the indoor training site.
- Group size at each indoor training machine will be six (6) participants.
- If using facility equipment, wipe down all grips and clubs with alcohol sanitizing wipes prior to and after each use.
- Participants to bring their own clearly labelled water/drink bottle and equipment
- Golf NL, staff, volunteers and participants are to adhere to the Sport Guidance that will be included in this package
- Participants must adhere to the following facility guidelines:
  1. Hand Sanitizer available upon entry
  2. Simulator cleaned between users
  3. Golf balls and tees switched out for sanitized balls and tees between users
  4. Food and beverage is single use.
  5. Simulator areas are marked on floor to assist with maintaining physical distance.
  6. All simulators are spread out.
  7. Attendance will be taken to allow for contact tracing as required.
  8. Limited (1 at a time) access to washrooms.
- Players are requested to leave the venue as soon as possible after the completion of their session.
- During all of these activities it will be necessary to have personal protective equipment (gloves, masks, etc.) available to help reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19 if initial medical or other attention is required for a participant.
- Participants will be required to complete the following documents if not previously submitted:
  - 1) Declaration of Compliance-Covid-19,
  - 2) Release of Liability, Waiver of Claims and Indemnity Agreement,

## **Appendix B Return To Competitions Guidelines**

The following guidelines have been prepared to facilitate the protection of the health and safety of players, Golf Newfoundland Labrador (Golf NL) staff, the host facility staff and volunteers. These protocols are to be used in conjunction with normal operating procedures and any supplementary local rules for Golf NL events.

Protocols may change based on government/facility regulations at the time of the competition.

### **COMPETITION OPERATING PRINCIPLES**

- Strictly adhere to government guidelines as well as industry best practices
- Strictly adhere to the host facility standards
- Control the flow of players and restrict gatherings
- Minimize the risk of exposure and spread of COVID-19

### **WAIVERS:**

- All players must agree to follow all Competition Protocols and sign the Golf NL Tournament Waiver and Release and Compliance Forms before completing the registration process and agreeing to participate.

### **ILLNESS:**

- If any player is showing signs of illness they should stay home.
- If a player becomes unwell / ill while at a facility, they should leave the facility in a manner intended to address the safety of the player and others.
- If the *Committee* becomes aware of a player appearing to be unwell / ill while at a facility, the *Committee* may require the player to leave the facility in a manner intended to address the safety of the player and others.
- Players who become unwell / ill should go to a COVID-19 Assessment Centre.
- If a player tests positive for COVID-19 they are asked to advise Golf NL and cooperate with Public Health in identifying close contacts.
- If Public Health deems there to be a risk to other players, volunteers, or staff, Golf NL will work with Public Health as needed, in identifying and contacting those individuals.

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- Withdrawals prior to a competition for any illness related issue will result in a full-refund minus the administration fee.

### **FIELD SIZES:**

- Competition fields will be limited to help reduce the number of players on course at any given time.

### **FIRST-TEE STARTS:**

- All championships will start from the first-tee only, as opposed to a “split-tee” start, to ensure social distancing on practice facilities prior to tee times and during weather delays.

### **LIVE SCORING:**

- Pace of play checkpoints will be reduced to the 9th and 18th greens only.

### **CADDIES:**

- Caddies will be prohibited for all championships.

### **POWER CARTS**

- Power carts will be permitted in the Amateur Championships only.

### **SPECTATORS:**

- No spectators of any kind (coaches included) will be permitted on the competition course during the competition. This includes the clubhouse area or parking lots. The only exception is as follows: Players 18 and under may have one accompanying parent, guardian or other adult. Those adults must adhere to the Golf NL Spectator Policy.

### **PULL CARTS:**

- Players wanting to use a pull cart may bring their own or rent a pull cart from the course if available.

### **FLAGSTICKS:**

- For the 2021 season, Golf NL will be using Pin Caddies, or equivalent, to restrict players from reaching into the hole to retrieve their ball. Players must not touch with their hand, or remove, the flagstick at any time. Removing or touching the flagstick will be a violation of the Golf NL Code of Conduct policy and may result in penalty.

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### **BUNKERS:**

- All bunker rakes will be removed from the golf course. Players may lift, clean and place their ball within one club length of where their original ball lay that is not nearer the hole and in the same bunker. Players are encouraged to smooth their footprints (with foot and/or club) to the best of their ability when exiting the bunker.

### **PHYSICAL DISTANCING:**

- Players and their golf bags should maintain a minimum six (6) feet of physical distance between themselves and other players. This includes when they are preparing for a shot, walking down the fairway/rough, on the teeing ground, on the putting green, and in the scoring area. Deliberate failure to maintain physical distance will be regarded as a violation of the Golf NL Code of Conduct policy which may result in penalty.

### **GATHERINGS:**

- No gathering of any kind is permitted at a Golf NL competition. Scoreboards (manual and electronic) will not be used. Players must leave the facility immediately after their round. Some exceptions may apply for playoffs (players will be notified). Players must not gather (multiple groups) on any tee deck if a hole is backed up. Physical distance must be maintained.

### **PRACTICE ROUNDS:**

- There will be a new policy for practice rounds that differs from what Golf NL has done in the past. Practice rounds will not necessarily take place on the day prior to the Championship. Players will be responsible to arrange their practice round date and time directly with the host facility based on availability.
- During the practice round, players must follow the operating procedures of the host facility, including protocols relating to their practice facilities. For more information please visit the tournament website.

### **FACILITY ARRIVAL:**

- Players must check in for every round with the Golf NL Greeter as soon as they arrive at the facility. Players are asked to arrive at the course no more than 30 minutes prior to their starting tee time. Players arriving earlier will be asked to remain in their vehicle.

### **PRACTICE FACILITIES:**

- To help reduce congestion on practice facilities, players will be assigned 20 minutes of warm-up time on the driving range and 10 minutes on the putting/chipping green prior to their tee time. This will be managed by host club staff. Driving range stalls will be spaced to allow for physical distancing, balls will be set out, and holes will be removed from practice putting and chipping greens. Practice after rounds will be prohibited.

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### **CLUBHOUSE:**

- Depending on government and host facility guidelines, the clubhouse may be closed to all players and accompanying adults with the exception of washroom use. Lockers will not be available. Access to the pro shop is based on host facility protocols.

### **REGISTRATION:**

- Championship registration will be conducted on the first round of the competition. Players will receive their championship welcome package at this time.

### **FOOD & BEVERAGE:**

- Traditional player socializing is not permitted before or after the round. A boxed lunch and a bottle of water will be provided on the 10th tee. There will be no on course water stations, players are encouraged to bring their own clearly labelled water bottles or purchase beverages from host facility.

### **CHAMPIONSHIP HEADQUARTERS:**

- Players and parents must call or e-mail the Tournament Director with any questions or concerns and should refrain from physically visiting Championship Headquarters.

### **PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE):**

- Players will be given a personal hand sanitizer bottle at championship registration upon check in, and will be asked to keep this bottle in their bag for the duration of the championship. Hand sanitizer will also be provided at the starting and scoring areas. All players are encouraged to bring and use their own PPE (non-medical masks, gloves, sanitizer, etc.).

### **EVACUATIONS:**

- In case of inclement weather, players and/or accompanying adults will be asked to return to their vehicles. If the clubhouse is open, players without a car can seek shelter inside the clubhouse while still maintaining physical distance. If shuttling players off the course is required, staff/referees/volunteers will be equipped with appropriate PPE given that physical distancing may be more challenging in such circumstances. At minimum, the driver and passenger will both be required to wear a non-medical mask, if the golf cart is not installed with an appropriate barrier. Instructions to resume play will be provided via text and email notifications to all players.

### **VOLUNTEERS:**

- Essential operational volunteers will be recruited to execute Golf NL events. Volunteer should arrive no later than 20 minutes before their assignment and must leave the facility immediately after their assignment.

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### **CHAMPIONSHIP DOCUMENTS:**

- Hole location sheets, official yardages, pace of play and the notice to players will only be available through the tournament website. A link to these documents will be e-mailed to all players in the field in advance. We encourage all players to familiarize themselves with this information prior to the start of the Championship.

### **SCORECARDS & STARTING:**

- Scorecards, pencils and tees will be provided only by the official starter.

### **SCORING:**

- At the conclusion of a round, players are asked to refrain from the traditional handshake or hug. Players must proceed to the scoring area to verify their scores with the scoring official. Scorecards will not be exchanged at the scoring area, scores will be read to the player by the marker and then verbally attested. Only two (2) people (the player and marker) will be permitted in the scoring area at a time (while maintaining physical distance). Players will be asked to leave the facility upon the completion of play. Players will not be permitted to use the practice facilities after their round. Some exceptions may apply for playoffs.

### **AWARDS PRESENTATION:**

- Only players who have won a medal will be permitted to attend the awards presentation, with the following exception: players 18 & Under may have one accompanying parent, guardian or other adult. Awards will be disinfected prior to players receiving them.



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### Appendix C Tely Tour Operational Policy 2021

#### Operational Protocols RE: COVID-19

By registering and playing any Tely Tour event, you acknowledge you have agreed to all policies and procedures as fully outlined on these pages.

PLEASE DO NOT PLAY IN TELY TOUR EVENTS IF YOU CANNOT ADHERE TO THE PROCEDURES BELOW. PLAYERS WHO DO NOT ADHERE TO THE OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PLAY ANY FUTURE TELY TOUR EVENTS.

#### Important Precautions for Players, Parents and Guardians

- No Spectators are allowed at Tely Tour events until further notice.
- Please bring your own water.
- Wash your hands frequently. If you can't wash them on the course, bring hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your face, including your mouth, nose, lips, or eyes.

#### Before you Arrive

If you answer 'YES' to any of these questions, please stay home:

- Are you sick or do you have flu-like symptoms?
- Have you tested positive for COVID-19 and not yet been fully cleared?
- Have you been in contact with someone affected with COVID-19 within the last 14 days?
- Are you required to self-isolate due to recent travel?
- 

#### Arriving at the Course

Upon arrival verbally notify a Tely Tour staff member at the registration table that you are present while maintaining physical distancing guidelines.

Please arrive at the course NO MORE than 30 minutes before your scheduled tee time.

Everyone must always obey the physical distance rule of maintaining a minimum of six feet. This includes at the registration area, putting green, driving range, through the completion of the round and at scoring.

#### On the Course

Bring your own tees and pencils as we will not have these for pick-up on-site until further notice.

Please do not switch scorecards.

Instead of a traditional handshake before or after your round, we recommend a friendly nod, a tip of your cap, or a simple wave as a form of greeting or sportsmanship.

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Players may take relief for a ball in a bunker as follows. Players may place their ball once in the bunker within one club-length of its original location and not nearer the hole. Once a player hits their ball out of the bunker, the player should do their best to smooth the sand with their feet.

Rakes will have been removed from bunkers at most courses. However, if a rake is present, please do not use it.

At this time, all players **MUST** leave the flagstick in. The Tely Tour will be using **Pin Caddies**, or equivalent, for each event in 2021.

### **After the Round & Scoring**

Upon completion of your round, the group will head to the general scoring area. Players will verbally agree to the hole-by-hole scores for each player. After agreeing, the marker will sign the scorecard and place the scorecard on the scoring table for the Tely Tour Staff to take a picture.

The Tely Tour will verify totals with each player and enter scores on the Tely Tour website.

All cards will be placed by the player in a box, scoring is final when a player leaves the scoring area, and players are asked to head home.

Do not gather at the clubhouse or any other common area.

Where permitted, we will conduct a limited awards presentation to the top-3 finishers in each division. Results will be posted online **ONLY**.

The health, and safety of our players, parents, staff and course operators is our top priority. Golf NL will continue to monitor the status of COVID-19 and amend these policies as required to ensure Tely Tour adheres to various guidelines and protocols as set forth by the various levels of government including the host golf course.
